## RULES

- I. The Society shall be composed of matriculated Members of Jesus College, Cambridge, and be called "THE JESUS COLLEGE CAMBRIDGE SOCIETY."
  - 2. The objects of the Society shall be :-
    - (a) To encourage intercourse between old Jesus men, and to keep them in touch with the College and its doings.
    - (b) To publish and circulate amongst its Members an Annual Report, containing a list of Members with their addresses, and all news of interest about the doings of the present and former Members of the College.
    - (c) To ensure the permanence and success of the Jesus College Dinner, held annually in London on the first day of the Inter-University Cricket Match, and to pay the incidental expenses thereof.
    - (d) To forward the interests of any College institution.
- 3. Every matriculated Member of the College shall be eligible for election to the Society, and upon election

and payment of one guinea shall become a Member of the Society, without being liable to any further expenses

- 4. The Officers of the Society shall consist of a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. The Master of the College shall be the President. In the event of a Vice-Master of the College being appointed, he shall become Vice-President. The Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
- 5. The management of the Society and the election of Members shall be vested in a Committee, consisting of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer two resident Fellows of the College nominated from time to time by the Master and Fellows, and sixteen elected members. At the Annual General Meeting one-fourth of the elected Members of the Committee shall retire from office. The retiring Members shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election, and amongst those of equal seniority the choice in default of agreement, shall be made by ballot. The vacancies so created shall be filled up at the same Meeting by a majority of the votes of those present and voting Casual vacancies may be filled up by the Committee, subject to confirmation at the next Annual General Meeting A Member elected to fill a casual vacancy shall retire at the time when the Member whose place he fills would have retired.
- 6. The administration of the funds of the Society shall be vested in the Committee, who may invest or otherwise deal with the same for the objects of the Society as they in their discretion may think fit. All

investments shall be made in the names of three Trustees to be appointed by the Committee.

- 7. The Committee shall meet as and when they may from time to time determine; five to form a quorum.
- 8. The Annual General Meeting of the Society shall be held in London or Cambridge on a day to be fixed by the Committee. At least fourteen days' notice of the Meeting shall be given by the Secretary in such manner as the Committee shall from time to time direct.
- 9. The Annual Report, containing a list of Members with their addresses, and all news of interest about the doings of the present and former Members of the College, shall be edited by the two resident Fellows who are Members of the Committee, in conjunction with the Secretary, and shall be sent to every Member of the Society.
- ro. The Committee in their discretion may, and, upon a written request signed by fifteen Members of the Society, shall call a Special General Meeting, the time and place for which shall be determined by the Committee. At least fourteen days' notice of such Meeting, stating the subject, shall be given in such manner as the Committee may direct.
- ri. If it appear to the Committee that the conduct of any Member of the Society is such as to render him unfit to remain a Member thereof, it shall be in their discretion to call a General Meeting to deal with the matter, and, in the event of its being decided at that

meeting by two-thirds of the Members present and voting that such Member be expelled from the Society, he shall thenceforth cease to be a Member, and forfeit all right to or claim upon the Society or its funds.

12. The Rules of the Society may be altered, but no alteration shall be made except at a General Meeting and by a majority of two-thirds of those present and voting, and unless notice of the proposed alteration has been stated on the notice calling the Meeting.

# Report of the Events of the Year, 1927-1928.

There were eighty-six matriculations in October and a few in January, so that during the year the College has been very full. Among the Freshmen are to be noticed such familiar names as Anstey, Carpmael, Fairbairn, Fraser, Hodson Mackenzie, Holloway, Keeling, Longland, Luxmoore, Randles, Spurrier, Walton, Willatt and Williams, so there is no fear of family traditions dving out.

For some years there has been no election to a Fellowship at Jesus. Now we look forward to welcoming Mr. Paul Sinker, who was elected last October, and who will come into residence next term after a year spent in Vienna and Asia Minor. Mr. Sinker is the son of Canon Robert Sinker, Vicar of St. Paul's, Southport. He came up as a scholar from Haileybury in 1924, and in due course took first classes in both parts of the Classical Tripos. He also captained the Rugby football team in his third year. Like other well-known members of the Society he is an enthusiastic mountaineer.

For some years it has been realized that the College has too few rooms for the number of men in residence. It does not seem likely that our numbers will again drop far below two

hundred and fifty, and the present buildings only accommodate about a hundred men; scholars have rooms for three years, and of the rest a considerable number never get into College at all. That is a deprivation which is keenly felt by many, and it is difficult for a man who never has a College room to enjoy the full privileges of College life. So at last the bold decision has been reached to add a new block to the College. Mr. Morley Horder has designed a building which is in some sense a continuation of the Carpenter building familiarly known as Chapel Court, with a return block at right angles extending into the Master's garden. The result will be that the East end of the Chapel will stand out into a new court, wherein nearly fifty new sets of rooms will be provided. The cost threatens to be heavy because only the best workmanship and materials can be used in such a scheme, and a new road will have to be made to the East of the present approach to Chapel Court; also a great deal of work will be involved in laying out the new court. But the plans have been very carefully considered, and it is confidently expected that when the building is finished it will be a permanent adornment to our beautiful College. The foundations are now being digged, and our optimistic bursar hopes to have the new rooms ready for occupation in October, 1929.

Many old Jesus men will learn with regret that James Hoppett, for many years head porter, had a serious breakdown in health at the end of the Lent term, and was advised to resign at once. He is now a patient at the Papworth Colony. After fifty-six years' service with the College Mr. J. Jiggins is retiring from the post of College Butler. In future the kitchen and the buttery will be under one management.

His successor, A. H. Austin, has served in the Marines, and already displays the adaptability

associated with that service.

The new series of windows which Dr. Nairne has provided in the old Library is now in place. The College owes much to the spirit which prompts such gifts. The Library has also been enriched by the gift of a facsimile of the Codex Bezae which

Dr. A. J. Mason left to us in his will.

Members of the Jesus College Society have already heard of the new venture which is being made in Camberwell. We have had no College Mission for some years, and so when the Head of Cambridge House asked us to undertake a Boys' Club we felt that the appeal deserved a response. The proposal was taken up keenly by a number of undergraduates, a general meeting was held, and during the May term an appeal was issued. Most of the resident undergraduates are contributing annually, and many old Jesus men have given donations to meet the initial expenses and subscriptions to keep the Club going.

The Master and the Dean have been to see the rooms which Cambridge House proposes to put at our disposal, and they report favourably. It is hoped that the Club will actually come into being in September, after which old Jesus men are invited to travel to Cambridge House (131, Camberwell Road) and see for themselves what is going on. At the moment we have not been

able to find a man to take charge of the Club; if this meets the eye of any old Jesus man who feels that he could give several evenings a week to such work we shall be more than glad to hear from him. The success of the venture depends upon our finding the right men to work on the spot, but happily we may rely at first on the experience and co-operation of the regular staff at Cambridge House.

College activities go on much as usual and the societies tend to multiply rather than to diminish. It is impossible to refer to them in detail, but mention may be made of the dinner of past and present Rustat scholars and exhibitioners which, thanks to the generous interest of Dr. Nairne and Mr. Manning, has recently become an annual function. No dinner in the year is more enjoyed.

The Boat Club has had rather mixed fortunes, details of which will be found on a later page. We did something to pay off past scores by winning the Ladies' Plate at Henley, beating our Selwyn

disciples by half a length in the final.

Blues have been rather scarce in College lately. Our stylistic peculiarities make it difficult for a Jesus man to win a place in the University crew, and perhaps it may be doubted whether we have had anyone lately who was good enough. At Association football N. Mace played in the forward line for the University team, and he also got his Corinthian cap. J. T. Morgan and E. T. Killick played against Oxford at Lord's, and R. R. T. Young and E. D. Andrews were the strength of the University lawn tennis side. We must not forget that E. W. Ormond represented

the University at boxing. We were fully represented in the Cambridge Lacrosse team.

There was the usual party of old Jesus men at the end of the May term, when nearly a score of those who were up just before the war found themselves "in College" once more. The weather was not very kind to us, but we hope they enjoyed the week-end. The Fellows always enjoy it

The new organ in the Chapel was used for the first time in the Michaelmas term, 1927. It is really the old organ in its beautiful case reconstructed and enlarged by the addition of a pedal organ and two new keyboards. The work has been done by Messrs. Harrison and Harrison, of Durham, and those who know declare that the result is one of the most interesting small organs in England. The old organ may still be played as a unit, but the player has at his command a great and a swell organ in addition. The improvement is very great.

During the long vacation the Master had disclosed the range of transitional Norman piers along the South side of the cloisters which were discovered when the war memorial was erected. It is not impossible that other finds will be made as the foundations of the new buildings are being digged. Already the stones of a round arch arranged horizontally in a circle seven feet below the surface have been discovered. How they got into that position is a mystery.

'Last summer the photographer of *Country Life* took a number of pictures of the College. Nothing has appeared yet, but Jesus men will be on the look out. If the pictures are equal

to those which have illustrated other articles the number in which they appear ought to be worth keeping.

W. E. A. Burr, who was up in 1919-1922, and was organ scholar of the College, has taken over the well-known Preparatory School, Doon House, Westgate-on-Sea (with Lieut.-Col. G. F. W. Anson, O.B.E. We wish him every success.

## Obituary

The Reverend Edmund Baddeley, who died on January 19th, 1928, at Deanwood, Cheltenham, was for long a familiar figure at Jesus College Society dinners. He came to us in October, 1876, and took his B.A. in 1880. He was ordained to the Curacy of Matlock in 1880, and was Rector of Long Marston from 1888 to 1924. Baddeley threw the hammer for Cambridge in 1877 and won against Oxford in 1878. He also got his Blue for the long jump in 1877, '78 and '79, winning in his last year. He was amateur champion for the long jump in 1878.

Dr. A. J. Mason, who died this year, was originally a Trinity man, but he was a Fellow of Jesus during the years that he held the Lady Margaret's Professorship of Divinity, 1896-1903. In 1909 he was elected to an Honorary Fellowship, and he always valued his connexion with the College. The last time he preached in Chapel was at the ordination of the Rev. H. B. Playford,

our late Chaplain.

The Reverend Thomas Godfrey Law Lushington, of the Park, Sandling, Maidstone, died in the early part of 1928. He came up as a scholar and took his Degree in 1874. Law Lushington was a member of a well-known Kent family, members of which have been distinguished in the Law and Indian Services. Of the many clerical appointments which he held mention may be made of the College living of Swavesey, and from 1911

to the time of his death he was Rural Dean of Sutton. He seldom missed the Jesus dinner.

Henry Sykes came up in 1879 and took his degree with second class honours in History in 1882. After a year at Ridley Hall he was ordained in 1883 and soon sailed to Palestine where most of his life was spent in missionary work. During the war he was compelled to return to England and he afterwards lived for some years in Cambridge doing occasional parochial work. In 1924 he was made Vicar of Yealand Convers. where he remained until his death. An evangelical of the old School, Sykes made his mark in Palestine. where "Sikké's word" has become proverbial for a standard of honour beyond the reach of common men. The country still remembers how he rode after a party of brigands to hand over another shilling which he had found in a waistcoat pocket after declaring that he had given up all he possessed. He wrote a soldier's guide to Palestine which proved very useful to British troops in the war; it contained many quotations from the Bible and, no less important, advice to treat with respect the Arabs whom he greatly admired. He was a good lawn tennis player and played against Oxford in the early days of the game. Later he devoted himself to golf, and he was a familiar figure tramping round the Gogs with two complete sets of clubs, right and left hand, for use as occasion required. He died suddenly, leaving a considerable fortune which, in a chatty preamble to his will, he explained as due to frugality and celibacy. He founded a University prize and enriched many good causes.

George Wallace died on November 24th, 1927, aged 73. He came up from St. Edmund's School, Canterbury, in 1873, took his degree in 1876, and afterwards was called to the bar at the Middle Temple, of which eventually he was a Bencher. He took silk in 1910. Wallace was joint author of a work on the Duty and Liability of Employers which went through four editions.

Rossell Harry Jephson Sasse came up with a mathematical scholarship from St. Paul's School in 1905, and in 1908 was a high Senior Optime. He was a Resident in the Nigerian Political

Service, and died on May 3rd, 1928.

Alfred Crichton Liddell died suddenly on August 26th, 1927. He came up to Jesus in 1882, and took a second in Classics in 1885. He was for many years a member of the Jesus College Society and served for some years on the committee. From 1887 to 1901 he was a Master at Nottingham High School, and from 1902 to the time of his death he was Assistant Master at Westminster.

Eldred Pascoe, late scholar of the College, died in South Africa on November 8th, 1927, at the age of 55. He was Rector of Michaelhouse,

Balgowan.

Many Jesus men of recent times will regret to hear of the death of C. R. Maconnell shortly after his return to Australia at the beginning of

this year.

Edward Arthur Bugle was born in British Guiana and came up in October, 1887, at the age of 18. Three years later he took his degree and returned to Demerara. He coxed Jesus boats with a merry efficiency proper to the office of cox.

Taking to the Law he became and long remained a stipendiary magistrate in British Guiana. He died in February, 1928.

Reginald Mannering came up in 1910, took his B.A. degree in 1913 and M.A. in 1917. Afterwards he went as a missionary to West Africa, but was compelled by health to return in 1919. He became Curate of St. John the Evangelist,

Blackheath, 1921-1923.

J. F. Marsh, who died suddenly in October, 1927, held for a time a Mastership at Rossall School, and afterwards conducted a successful private school. He held the cricket record for the inter-university match, 172 not out, in 1904. In the College he was also prominent as an Association footballer.

Edwin Roy Watson, born July 20th, 1880, died November 10th, 1926, came up to Jesus College in 1899 from Nottingham High School with a Foundation Scholarship in Natural Sciences. He was placed in the first class in the Natural Sciences Tripos, Part I, in 1901, and in the second class in Part II (Chemistry) in 1903. After a course of research work in Organic Chemistry with Dr. S. Ruhemann in the Caius Laboratory he was appointed, in 1904, Professor of Chemistry in the Sidpur Engineering College, Bengal. Two years later he was appointed to the chair of Chemistry at Dacca College which he occupied until 1921 when he became Principal of the newly established Government Technological Institute at Cawnpore. This office he held until the time of his death, which occurred suddenly while he was on leave in London. Watson's chief

scientific interest lay in the origin of colour in dves and the effect of molecular structure on colour intensity, and, in spite of the difficult conditions under which he had to work, he published numerous experimental papers on these subjects as well as a useful book—"Colour in Relation to Chemical Constitution " (Longman, Green and Co. 1018). He took an active part in the formation of the Indian Chemical Society, and whilst Principal of the Cawnpore Institute, where he had less opportunity for purely scientific work, he was responsible for some twenty communications to the journal of that Society on the utilisation of Indian natural products. He married Lily Marv Hurlston, of Learnington Spa, in 1908, and had two children who died in infancy.

Details have been received by mail of the tragic death of Captain Robert Graves Blackburne Farrer, of the Malay Civil Service, at the age of 30. The youngest son of Canon H. R. W. Farrer Sub-Dean of Salisbury Cathedral, he was educated at Sandroyd and Marlborough, where he had a distinguished career, going up to Jesus College. Cambridge, with a scholarship. During the war he held a commission in the R.F.A., becoming liaison officer to General Kirwan. C.B. Having passed as a War Cadet into the Civil Service, he went out at the age of 22 to the Federated Malay States. He held various posts in Kuala Lumpur, Seremban, and Singapore; more recently at Kampar, Bruas, and at Pasir Puteh, where he had been stationed the last three and a half years. The Malay Mail wrote: "R. G. B. Farrer's death leaves the country bereft of one of its most promising Civil servants and his friends of a man who stood for all that friendship means. He was a keen sportsman, playing cricket and football for Perak and Selangor, while seven tigers and much other game fell to his gun. His last piece of important work was the turning of the straggling village of Pasir Puteh into a well laid-out and roaded town, the carrying out of which could only have been done by a man of wonderful energy and tact, who was absolutely trusted by the 70,000 natives among whom he lived, a single white man."

When the recent troubles in Trengganu made it necessary to guard the Kelantan frontier Farrer had no need to call for volunteers, and the frontier was so well guarded by his natives that the revolutionaries found they had no chance of making an entrance. A local Durbar had been planned for June 5th to celebrate the making of Pasir Puteh into a town, and a number of fireworks and Japanese bombs had been purchased. At about 9 p.m. four of these bombs had been fired, but the fifth failed to explode. Farrer went to ascertain the cause, and as he bent down the bomb exploded, striking him with tremendous force under the right arm, and before a doctor could reach him he had died from hemorrhage. His funeral was attended by the Sultan of Kelantan, with all the members of the State Council and the leading men of all communities. An immense crowd of natives who had travelled 25 miles from Pasir Puteh were also present, all following the European to his grave.

a thing quite unprecedented in the annals of Kelantan.

In the obituary notice of L. R. Flood last year we were thought to imply that he was the only surviving member of the famous crew of 1872, which from seventh made its way to second on the river. The Rev. G. H. Gray calls our attention to the fact that other members of the crew are still alive, W. H. M. Bayley who rowed 7 and he himself who rowed 2.

HONOURS The Sedgwick Prize for Geology was awarded to W. B. R. King, formerly Fellow of Jesus College and now Fellow of Magdalene.

The Porson Prize for Greek Iambic Verse was awarded to Eric Joseph Frank, Scholar of Jesus College. This is the first time that this distinction has been won by a Jesus man.

The Stephen Hicks' prize of the Law Society was won by L. N. Battersby, M.A., in January,

1028.

**BOOKS** The Life Eternal: Here and Now. By Alexander Nairne, D.D. Longmans, 3/6.

The author tells us that "the book has a practical aim, and is intended to cheer those who mourn, by showing that eternal life is the life of the Spirit, not of sense, that it is not a future life but here and now, that death does not interrupt the true communion of soul."

The late Mr. Edmund Gosse gave a full and appreciative account of this work in the *Sunday Times*. We may quote from the review by Mr.

T R. Glover in The Cambridge Review:

"One of the most charming Loeb volumes so far has been the Theocritus translated by Mr. Edmonds, and here we have from the same skilled hand the third and last instalment of the Greek lyre which he has been editing. It is an interesting volume with Bacchylides, and the supremely tiresome Timotheus, the scolia and the singing-games. (It is rather odd, by the way that scholars who still play with Greek verse don't seem to realise how evidently Nature designed the scolion quatrain for the translation of Limericks.) Mr. Edmonds (like most authors as he says), writes his introduction last of all; but he prints his last too, and here it is full of learning and small print. The volume runs to 719 pages, in large and small type, in Greek and English; probably apart from the Bible you could nowhere else buy so much print and paper for ten shillings. So the book is at once a monument of the humanism of Mr. Edmonds and Mr. Loeb. And the latest fragments of our authors shall come in second editions of the two earlier parts; nor are we to wait long."-T.R.G.

Quantitative Analysis. By Dennis Brook Briggs, M.A., late scholar of Jesus College. Sidgwick and

Jackson, 3/6.

An introduction to gravimetric and volumetric analysis, with explanations of methods, outlines of supplementary experiments, etc., intended for use by students working for the Higher Certificate, First Medical Examinations, etc.

Classified Problems in Chemistry. By Dennis Brook Briggs, M.A., F.C.S. Sidgwick & Jackson, 3/6

Another book by the same author intended to help the same class of students.

Saint Giles. By F. Brittain. Crown 8vo. 3/6. Mr. Brittain, who has already published two small books on St. Radegund, now pursues his studies in hagiology with a critical though sympathetic enquiry into the legend and cult of one of the most popular saints of the Middle Ages.

Cyril Wanklyn, B.A., who has been engaged for many years upon research into the history of Lyme Regis has been rewarded by the discovery of a document written by Henry Fielding at the age of 19. It is a half sheet of notepaper which the author of Tom Jones posted on the door of the Town Hall protesting against his defeat when he went to Lyme Regis to abduct an heiress, Sarah Andrew, the ward of her uncle, Andrew Tucker.

ROWING

The year has not been without its disappointments to the Boat Club and therefore to the College. Numbers are well maintained and enthusiasm is unabated, but we have lost the headship both of the Lents and the Mays.

In the Michaelmas term we put on two light fours. The second four defeated Trinity Hall, a crew which contained a blue and two trial caps-to-be, but they were not good enough for First Trinity next day. The first four easily disposed of Lady Margaret, and then in the semifinal rowed a dead heat against Selwyn. Three boats rowed in the final, and Third Trinity won from Jesus by seven seconds.

No Jesus man rowed in the University Trials, but F. D. Griggs coxed for the second year in succession.

The Lents were not enjoyable, owing partly to a persistent gale which swept down the Long Reach; and although we have no wish to make excuses there can be no doubt that conditions favoured First Trinity on the second day. On the first day First made their usual spurt at the start, just missed us at Grassey, and finished well behind. But on the second day our men, who had gone all out at the start in anticipation of another rush, felt the strain severely up the Reach and were overhauled just beyond the railway bridge. On the two last days conditions moderated a little, and Jesus finished well within their distance.

The second boat lost a place to Pembroke, but their position of fourth on the river is still one of which we have a right to be proud. The third boat kept its place, and the fourth boat went down three places—all to College second boats.

During the Easter vacation two boats rowed at Putney, and in the "Head of the River" races Jesus I retained their position of third on the river.

If we did not stay head in the Mays it was not for want of trying, for our boats probably worked harder in practice than any College crews on record, and one day they paddled to Ely and back in pursuit of the theory that "mileage makes the oar."

On the first day of the races the first boat kept away from First Trinity with an ease which

raised our hopes and contradicted our expectations. But the second day proved that our pursuers had not done themselves justice, and we were bumped in the Plough Reach. Our defeat was disappointing but not humiliating, for First Trinity had an exceptional crew. The Times correspondent remarked that not one of the Jesus crew would have found a place in the Trinity boat; and although that was perhaps unduly patronizing, the fact remains that First Trinity thoroughly deserved to be head of the river.

Defeat is apt to be demoralizing, and on Saturday we were bumped by another good crew,

Third Trinity.

The loss of the headship was perhaps less discouraging than the poor performance of the lower boats which all lost places. The third and fourth crews were mostly Freshmen who may be trusted to improve, but for the last two years these boats have gone down steadily, and conservatives are still questioning the advantages of swivel row-locks for beginners.

It is pleasant to be able to end on a more cheerful note. At Henley our crews both improved, and although we did not enter for the Grand, we astonished the critics by beating some good boats in the heats of the Ladies' Plate and by winning the final from Selwyn by half a length. In practically every race we were led at the start and only Mackinnon's perseverance and the grit of his crew brought us in at the end. Perhaps "mileage" had something to do with it. The College four were beaten in the final of the

Visitors' Cup by First Trinity. The second eight made a good fight in the Thames Cup, and the four made some progress in the Wyfolds.

Of the battle of the styles enough has been said in the papers, but *The Times* article describing Henley suggests that the faith of the orthodox

is being shaken.

The Captain and Secretary for the year have been Mackinnon and Assheton. Lance has been

elected Captain for next year.

Steve Fairbairn has coached us with infinite enthusiasm and to him the continued thanks

of the Boat Club are due.

We had a most successful season and were probably the best College

team in the University, but examinations and University cricket prevented us from ever putting our full strength into the field. J. T. Morgan and E. T. Killick have played regularly for the University and have both been awarded their blues. Cecil Cook, owing to examinations, was hardly ever able to play. Among the Freshmen we found some very good talent, and colours were awarded to H. R. W. Butterworth, R. L. D. Gilson, and C. H. Williams. Butterworth has been the most useful man on our side, both as batsman and bowler; on one occasion he actually opened and played right through the innings. Formby and Woolf did the work of fast bowlers,

and "Joe" Bell has been a useful wicket-keeper. Owen Firth proved himself an admirable captain for a College side, but it was unfortunate that an injured knee prevented him from bowling

FOOTBALL

In these days a very large number of men want to play "Rugger." From them it is an easy matter to pick three fifteens, and for several years we have had two second teams and an occasional third. Yet the performance of the first fifteen has not come up to expectations. On paper we seemed to have a formidable side, but on the field they failed to get together and our record was poor

To quote Chanticlere, "The season 1927-8 cannot be said to have been a success from any point of view. Our performances in the Christmas term were poor, but that has now become a Jesus tradition, and one no longer complains. In past years, whatever impression we may have given in ordinary College games, we had proved ourselves to be an extremely hard side to beat in the knock-out competition." This year, however, we drew Pembroke, the ultimate winners, in the first round, and were heavily defeated. Perhaps the Jesus team were unduly depressed; Pembroke had such a side as few colleges could expect to stand up against, and Windsor Lewis played a brilliant game.
