RULES.

- 1. The Society shall be composed of matriculated Members of Jesus College, Cambridge, and be called "THE JESUS COLLEGE CAMBRIDGE SOCIETY."
 - 2. The objects of the Society shall be :-
 - (a) To encourage intercourse between old Jesus men, and to keep them in touch with the College and its doings.
 - (b) To publish and circulate amongst its Members an Annual Report, containing a list of Members with their addresses, and all news of interest about the doings of the present and former Members of the College.
 - (c) To ensure the permanence and success of the Jesus College Dinner, held annually in London on the first day of the Inter-University Cricket Match, and to pay the incidental expenses thereof.
 - (d) To forward the interests of any College institution.

- 3. Every matriculated Member of the College shall be eligible for election to the Society, and upon election and payment of one guinea shall become a Member of the Society, without being liable to any further expense.
- 4. The Officers of the Society shall consist of a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. The Master of the College shall be the President. In the event of a Vice-Master of the College being appointed, he shall become Vice-President. The Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
- 5. The management of the Society and the election of Members shall be vested in a Committee, consisting of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, two resident Fellows of the College nominated from time to time by the Master and Fellows, and sixteen elected Members. At the Annual General Meeting one-fourth of the elected Members of the Committee shall retire from office. The retiring Members shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election, and amongst those of equal seniority the choice, in default of agreement, shall be made by ballot. The vacancies so created shall be filled up at the same Meeting by a majority of the votes of those present and voting. Casual vacancies may be filled up by the Committee, subject to confirmation at the next Annual General Meeting. A Member elected to fill a casual vacancy shall retire at the time when the Member whose place he fills would have retired.

- 6. The administration of the funds of the Society shall be vested in the Committee, who may invest or otherwise deal with the same for the objects of the Society as they in their discretion may think fit. All investments shall be made in the names of three Trustees to be appointed by the Committee.
- 7. The Committee shall meet as and when they may from time to time determine; five to form a quorum.
- 8. The Annual General Meeting of the Society shall be held in London or Cambridge on a day to be fixed by the Committee. At least fourteen days' notice of the Meeting shall be given by the Secretary in such manner as the Committee shall from time to time direct.
- 9. The Annual Report, containing a list of Members with their addresses, and all news of interest about the doings of the present and former Members of the College, shall be edited by the two resident Fellows who are Members of the Committee, in conjunction with the Secretary, and shall be sent to every Member of the Society.
- 10. The Committee in their discretion may, and, upon a written request signed by fifteen Members of the Society, shall call a Special General Meeting, the time and place for which shall be determined by the Committee. At least fourteen days' notice of such Meeting, stating the subject, shall be given in such manner as the Committee may direct.

- 11. If it appear to the Committee that the conduct of any Member of the Society is such as to render him unfit to remain a Member thereof, it shall be in their discretion to call a General Meeting to deal with the matter, and, in the event of its being decided at that Meeting by twothirds of the Members present and voting that such Member be expelled from the Society, he shall thenceforth cease to be a Member and forfeit all right to or claim upon the Society or its funds.
- 12. The Rules of the Society may be altered, but no alteration shall be made except at a General Meeting and by a majority of two-thirds of those present and voting, and unless notice of the proposed alteration has been stated on the notice calling the Meeting.

REPORT OF THE EVENTS OF THE YEAR 1913—1914.

The year has been a comparatively uneventful one, and there are few changes to report.

Mr. Welsh has felt compelled by reason of delicate health to resign his post of Tutor, to the great grief of all those who were intimately associated with him. Fortunately he still retains his post of Mathematical Lecturer, and has consented to become an Assistant Tutor; consequently we know that the interests of the mathematical and engineering students will be well attended to. Mr. Elliott, our History Lecturer, has been made a Tutor.

The freshmen of last October were rather an uninteresting lot, though of course there were exceptions. There were a number of quite good rowing men, but the number of recruits to our field sports were very few indeed, and none of these of real excellence. As our strength lay for the most part in third-year men, it is not a happy look-out for the coming year.

The putting down of the new system of drainage, begun in the Long of 1912, was happily completed last year. We are compelled every vacation to have the College patrolled during the night, as the "militants" in the Eastern Counties are very active.

The serious illness of Mrs. Morgan during the winter months caused us all much anxiety, and her recovery was a great relief to her numerous friends. The windows in memory of the late Master are now in Cambridge, and will be put up forthwith. The improvements in the decoration of the Hall, for which he left money, will be taken in hand this Long. Nothing in the nature of radical changes will be made.

During the year the Dean has provided us with a series of preachers in Chapel of exceptional excellence, from the Dean of St. Paul's to himself.

Obituary. Henry Minshull Stockdale, J.P., of Mears Ashby, Northants, died early in October, 1913, at the age of 91. His family has long been connected with Jesus College, and two of his sons were here in the early eighties. He was a Deputy-Lieutenant for the county, and also a Lieutenant of the old Volunteers, and was one of those who attended the King's Levee in 1911 for officers who joined the forces before 1860. As his commission dated from 1853, he was probably the oldest man holding a commission.

The Rev. C. L. Banister, late of Bishamston Vicarage, Pershore, died at the beginning of June, 1914.

Franklin Marten Rudd died in August, 1913, at the early age of 43, after a long and painful illness borne with the pluck and cheerfulness which were so characteristic of him. Before coming up to Jesus College in 1891, he had been for some years in South Africa, and with his father, Mr. C. D. Rudd, accompanied the first expedition to Mashonaland when the concessions which laid the foundation of Rhodesia were obtained. After leaving Cambridge he returned to Johannesburg, and was engaged there in business at the time of the Jameson

Raid, in which he took an active part. In later years he settled in London, and his early death came as a blow to his many friends, old Jesus men of all years and other members of the New Oxford and Cambridge Club, with whom he was deservedly most popular.

Rev. E. Hughes, M.A., Rector of Ashwell, Rutland, died in the Michaelmas term, at the age of 61. He had previously held the livings of St. Leonard's, Wallingford and Dingley, Northamptonshire. He was educated at Shrewsbury. At Jesus College he was quite a good rowing man, though overshadowed by his elder brother, Rev. Thomas E. Hughes, who is still with us. The two brothers were strangely alike, so that when the younger first appeared in Chapel, the Chapel Clerk gave him a seat among the senior men. He was also mistaken for his elder brother by many of the senior men themselves. His elder brother was called 'Tommy,' and naturally he was called 'Young Tommy.' His son is a freshman exhibitioner of the College.

News has reached England by cable that George H. Rhodes has died in Australia, about the middle of June, of heart disease. He resided in Jesus College, 1881-1883.

A promising, but delicate undergraduate, L. S. Mackie, died on November 12th, 1913. He had miserable health all the previous year, when he was a freshman.

Fellowships. H. S. Jones, B.A., who had previously been appointed one of the two chief assistants at the Royal Observatory, was elected to a Fellowship last Michaelmas term. He is being sent out to Minsk, Russia, in charge of the expedition to make observations on the eclipse of the sun.

Honours. In 1913, First Classes were obtained as follows: Mathematical Tripos, Part I, A. F. Akhurst and E. G. Myddelton; Part II, C. E. Jones (with distinction); Classical, Part I, O. V. Guy, F. Hardwick and W. R. Taylor; Natural Science, Part I, H. D. McIlroy; Mediæval and Modern Languages, E. M. Aron with distinction in spoken Spanish. Aron was the first student who has obtained a first class in Spanish. He had previously won the same distinctions in German.

Francis Shillington Scales, M.A., M.D. was awarded the Raymond Horton Smith Prize for his Thesis on "The electro-cardiac diagram as an aid to diagnosis,"

A. K. Gray, B.A., son of the Master, was honourably mentioned for the Harness Prize.

H. D. Barnard, who last term was elected Secretary of the Union, was this term elected Vice-President without opposition. At the election in the Michaelmas term J. C. Holmes, B.A., easily headed the poll for Members of Committee.

H. D. L. Minton was elected an Associate of the C. U. Philosophical Society while still an undergraduate.

The Fothergill gold medal of the Medical Society of London for 1914 was awarded to John George Adami, F.R.S., M.D., late Fellow, for his work on Pathology and its application to practical medicine and surgery.

The Hon. Thomas Henry Watson, B.A., LL.B., was, on December 12, 1913, elected M.P. for South Lanarkshire after a very hard fight. He is a Unionist.

In March, 1914, Frank Gordon Breed and Elliott John Hodgson won Bell Scholarships.

Mr. Elliott is again examining for the Historical Tripos.

C. W. G. Eady was thirty-sixth in the Indian Civil Service Competition, and has been given a post in the India Office in London.

F. C. Gentry, King's School, and K. S. Chandler, Leys, were elected to Exhibitions.

The Frank Allhusen prize was awarded to H. V. Parker, B.A.

Degrees.

T. W. Crafer and A. Nairne have taken D.D. degrees; B. A. I. Peters, M.D.; W. K. L. Clarke, A. C. Cooper-Marsdin, and A. Nairne, B.D.; R. M. Vick. M.C.; H. W. Barnes, F. J. Thorne, and E. J. Bradley, M.B., B.C.; and I. P. H. Davies and H. J. Shields, M.B., and 21 members of the College have taken M.A.

The number of Divinity degrees is notable. The degree of M.C. is a very difficult one to obtain, being given

only to those who are really Masters in Surgery. The last Jesus man to gain this degree was Bernard Pitts, Consulting Surgeon to St. Thomas' Hospital, well known to the older members of our Society.

Appoint= Mr. Ephraim Levine, M.A., formerly scholar ments, of the College, who recently took first classes in etc. Oriental Languages and Theology, has been appointed minister of the St. John's Wood Synagogue, one of the principal Jewish congregations in London. His appointment is highly praised in the SUNDAY TIMES in their weekly article entitled *The Week in Jewry*.

Rev. H. E. Wynn, M.A., has been appointed Examining Chaplain to the Bishop of Sheffield.

Dr. F. Shillington Scales has for some time now had full charge of the X-ray and Radium Department of Addenbrooke's Hospital.

Books. During the past year our College has contributed four works of real importance to Theology. First among these in order of time, and perhaps also of merit, is Professor Nairne's *Epistle of Priesthood*. This is a disquisition on the Epistle to the Hebrews, and for its scholarship, insight and wide choice of illustration will rank high among the books on this most difficult of Epistles. For this admirable piece of work the University gave the author the degree of B.D., and the D.D. was given soon after for a very compact and erudite work entitled *The Faith of the Gospels*, which forms part of

the Layman's Library, projected by Professors Burkitt and Newson.

Mr. Crafer has obtained his D.D. degree by a very learned attempt to reconstruct the work of Porphyry, the great literary opponent of Christianity, in which he breaks a lance with no less redoubtable a champion than Dr. Harnack.

Scarcely less erudite is Mr. W. K. Lowther Clarke's, B.D., thesis on St. Basil the Great, which no future student of Early Monasticism will be able to disregard. Curiously enough a fitting companion to this work is Canon Cooper-Marsdin's, B.D., thesis, The History of the Islands of the Serins; The Monastery Saints and Theologians of St. Honorat. This monastery attained to much fame in the fifth century, and the present book fills up a great gap in our Church Histories. The reviews of all these works have been most favourable. It says something for the Theological School of so small a College that out of thirty-three D.D. degrees awarded for a thesis in the last ten years seven have been given to Jesus men, all old pupils of the present Dean.

The Athenian Empire and the Great Illusion, by E. M. W. Tillyard, B.A., Fellow of Jesus College. This interesting little essay won the Garton Prize offered by the Cambridge University War and Peace Society. In it he endeavours to show that war does not pay, neither does trade follow the flag. Whether one agrees with him or not, one must admire his careful research, especially in the distribution of Athenian pottery throughout the Greek world. Mr. Tillyard is still busily engaged in

photographing and classifying the Deepdene Collection of Greek vases.

J. M. Edmunds has done some most important classical research, of which we have not got particulars at the time of going to press.

The River. Jesus rowing during the past year has been in a satisfactory state. We had two light fours. The first did not get quite together, although it won a heat. The second showed a high standard of merit, and in the final heat was only just beaten by Third Trinity, which contained the stroke and President of the University Crew. In the Colquhouns we sent in a large entry, and R. Gould survived to the final heat, losing only on the post to Ivor Day of Lady Margaret.

In the Lents the first boat regained the headship from First Trinity and the other boats went up. Gould and Oldham won the Lowe Double Sculls, and we were also in the final heat of the Clinker Fours.

In the "May" races our first boat quite easily retained the headship, our second boat gained a place at the expense of Trinity Hall's first boat, and our third boat went down to St. Catherine's first boat, which was coached by a Jesus man. Our first boat is a bit rough, but powerful, with a better leg drive than ever, thanks to Eric Fairbairn's careful coaching. If it improves further it should be the most formidable of English crews for the Grand at Henley. No club has had the luck to be so often in the final or the misfortune to win so seldom.
